ISIAH AND TEISHA'S STORY

"This is a place we found refuge. It was a place of support for us, a home that you just can't forget."

Surrounded by instability, Isiah and Teisha found community at Layla's House. Soon after, they were uprooted and re-introduced to Champions for Children's programs at the birth of their third child.

During Josiah's birth, they received muchneeded support and resources. These also helped strengthen their relationship and family foundation. Additionally, Isiah found the fathering support he had been craving. Now, Isiah and Teisha are committed to helping other families find the same support.

ALLISON AND RICK'S STORY

MICHELLE'S STORY

Champions' Parents as Teachers program gave Michelle the assurance she needed for her son's development.

Michelle first learned about Champions for Children through the hospital after an unplanned C-section left her in pain and unsure of how she would manage as a new mom. With no family nearby for support, she often felt like she was navigating parenthood alone.

Through the Parents as Teachers program, Michelle grew confident. Seth, her son, wasn't walking when they began, but with the guidance of her parent educator, he met his milestones and began walking developmentally on track. Today, Michelle feels supported and empowered, celebrating every step of Seth's development.

We expanded our Parents as Teachers and Great We Grow programs.

We have added staff, expanded program experiences, and deepened partner relationships. Special thanks to the Children's Board of Hillsborough County for their support!

Our Family Learning Center program launched SPARK.

Thanks to funding from the Broadrick Family Foundation, SPARK (Supportive Programming for Adolescents Raising Kids) offers parent education and support services for teen parents.

Kids on the Block is now reaching more elementary school students.

KOTB expanded personal safety education programs in Hillsborough County to include 1st, 2nd, and 5th grade, which teach supporting peers and maintaining internet safety.



ABC Program

A community resource providing education and breastfeeding support for new parents and families

Family Learning Center

A resource helping parents who are in treatment for substance abuse at lbis Healthcare. FLC offers parenting education, visitation playgroups, and support groups.

Baby Bungalow

A parent-child learning and resource center offering playgroups, workshops, and developmental checkups for new parents and families with children birth to 5 years old.

FRANC

A dedicated hub for support and services that are focused on fatherhood, including "Nurturing Dads" classes, community events, and more.

DULCE

DULCE is a familycentered program that supports infants birth to one year by addressing their health needs within the pediatric care setting.

A parent-child learning and resource center serving Town-n-Country offering playgroups, workshops, and developmental checkups for families with children birth to 5 years old.

Educational puppet shows for elementary students that teach personal safety about abuse, bullying, and stereotype prevention..

Parents as Teachers

A research-backed, home-visiting program that promotes healthy child development, school readiness, and family well-being for families with children prenatal through kindergarten.

Layla's House

A parent-child learning and resource center in Sulphur Springs offering education and support activities for expecting parents and families with children birth to 5 years old.

Tailored classes, workshops, and case management services supporting parenting skills, healthy parental relationships, financial health, and parenting confidence.


